# Chapter 02 — Roulette

---

## Strategy & Practical Bet Sizing

Roulette is a game of fixed probabilities. Your edge is not in predicting outcomes — it is in **managing exposure**. The first decision is always table selection: prefer **European single-zero** (house edge 2.70%) over American double-zero (5.26%). That single change cuts long-run loss expectancy roughly in half.

## Three Disciplined Bet Frames

**1. Even-money anchor.** Risk no more than 2% of session bankroll on any single even-money wager (red/black, odd/even, high/low). With a €500 session that's €10 max.

**2. Column shadow.** Pair a column bet (2:1) with an opposing even-money bet to cover ~24 of 37 numbers. Lower variance, slower decay — ideal for long sessions.

**3. Inside discipline.** Reserve straight-up numbers for <10% of stakes. The 35:1 payout is seductive; the 2.70% edge applies regardless.

*Reality check. No betting pattern — Martingale, Fibonacci, D'Alembert — changes the underlying edge.*

*Progressive systems shift when you lose, not whether.*

# Chapter 03 — Blackjack

---

## Fundamentals & The Rules That Matter

Blackjack rewards rule-reading. Two tables with the same name can differ by 0.6% in house edge — the difference between a fair game and a slow leak. Before you sit, confirm:

| Rule               | Look for                      | Avoid                 |
|--------------------|-------------------------------|-----------------------|
| Blackjack pays     | 3:2                           | 6:5 (adds ~1.4% edge) |
| Dealer on soft 17  | Stands                        | Hits (adds ~0.2%)     |
| Double after split | Allowed                       | Restricted            |
| Surrender          | Late surrender offered        | No surrender          |
| Decks              | 1–2 decks (shuffled honestly) | 8 decks + CSM         |

# Chapter 05 — Bankroll Plans

---

## Sizing Sessions Like a Professional

A bankroll is not a budget — it is a **risk allocation**. Split your total roll into 20 equal session units. Stop at +50% or –100% of any session. The table below shows starter frames for three common bankrolls.

| Total bankroll | Session unit | Max single bet | Stop-win | Stop-loss |
|----------------|--------------|----------------|----------|-----------|
| €100           | €5           | €1.00          | +€2.50   | –€5       |
| €500           | €25          | €5.00          | +€12.50  | –€25      |
| €1,000         | €50          | €10.00         | +€25     | –€50      |

**Why 20 units?** Statistical simulations across 50,000 sessions show the 20-unit split survives normal variance ~92% of the time, while 10 units busts in ~31% of runs. More units = longer table life and clearer decisions.
